**Fiscal summary statement:**

The budget for this improvement project is \$1,190,000 allocated between four individual components as follows:

- 1. Sidewalk at 16<sup>th</sup> and Chestnut (\$220,000)
- 2. Sidewalk on 18<sup>th</sup> Street between Maple and Jackson Park (\$415,000)
- 3. Upgrades on Peck's Drive at the intersections of Cady Road and East Drive (\$170,000)
- 4. Pedestrian access from Interurban Trail to YMCA (\$385,000)

The funding source for all improvements will be Fund 145 – Street and Alley Vacation Funds.

**Project summary statement:** This improvement project contains four separate components.

- 1. Adding approximately 350 feet of sidewalk at 16<sup>th</sup> Street and Chestnut Street to provide contiguous pedestrian access from Chestnut Street to East Marine View Drive.
- 2. Constructing a new sidewalk along 18<sup>th</sup> Street between Maple and Jackson Park to complete a pedestrian link from West of Walnut to Jackson Park.
- 3. The design and construction of new pedestrian facilities on Peck's Drive to include the replacement of an existing overhead flashing beacon with a new Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacon (RRFB) at the intersection with Cady Road and ADA curb ramp upgrades at the intersection of Cady Road and East Drive.
- 4. The design and construction of pedestrian improvements between Alta Drive and Colby Avenue and a new crosswalk at 48<sup>th</sup> and Colby Avenue with a RRFB to complete a pedestrian link between the Interurban Trail at Alta Drive and Colby Avenue to enhance pedestrian access to the new YMCA and Emma Yule Park.

**Recommendation (exact action requested of Council):**

Adopt an Ordinance creating a special improvement project entitled "Fund 145 Non-Motorized Improvements" Fund 303, Program 118.



**ORDINANCE NO.** \_\_\_\_\_

**An ORDINANCE creating a special improvement project entitled “Fund 145 Non-Motorized Improvements” Fund 303, Program 118, to accumulate all costs for the improvement.**

**WHEREAS,**

- A. The City of Everett is committed to a planned pedestrian and non-motorized infrastructure improvement program.
- B. The City of Everett has identified the need and obtained funds to design and construct certain pedestrian accessibility improvements.

**NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY OF EVERETT DOES ORDAIN:**

**Section 1.** A special improvement project is hereby established as Fund 303, Program 118, entitled “Fund 145 Non-Motorized Improvements” to accumulate all costs for the improvement. Authorization is hereby given to accumulate costs and distribute payments for the improvement project.

**Section 2.** Authorization is hereby granted for the “Public Works Director” or “City Engineer” under the direction of the Mayor, to assume full and complete responsibility for conducting all tasks and doing all things to accomplish the actions authorized in this ordinance

**Section 3.** The sum of \$1,190,000 is hereby appropriated to Fund 303, Program 118, “Fund 145 Non-Motorized Improvements” as follows:

A. Estimated Project Design and Construction Costs	\$1,190,000
B. Source of Funds	
Fund 145 – Street and Alley Vacation Funds	\$1,190,000

**Section 4.** The City Clerk and the codifiers of this Ordinance are authorized to make necessary corrections to this Ordinance including, but not limited to, the correction of scrivener’s/clerical errors, references, ordinance numbering, section/subsection numbers, and any internal references.

**Section 5.** The City Council hereby declares that should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause or

phrase of this ordinance be declared invalid for any reason, it is the intent of the City Council that it would have passed all portions of this ordinance independent of the elimination of any such portion as may be declared invalid.

**Section 6.** The enactment of this Ordinance shall not affect any case, proceeding, appeal or other matter currently pending in any court or in any way modify any right or liability, civil or criminal, which may be in existence on the effective date of this Ordinance.

**Section 7.** It is expressly the purpose of this Ordinance to provide for and promote the health, safety and welfare of the general public and not to create or otherwise establish or designate any particular class or group of persons who will or should be especially protected or benefited by the terms of this Ordinance. It is the specific intent of this Ordinance that no provision or any term used in this Ordinance is intended to impose any duty whatsoever upon the City or any of its officers or employees. Nothing contained in this Ordinance is intended nor shall be construed to create or form the basis of any liability on the part of the City, or its officers, employees or agents, for any injury or damage resulting from any action or inaction on the part of the City related in any manner to the enforcement of this Ordinance by its officers, employees or agents.
