Project: Fulton Street Bicycle Pedestrian Corridor

Partner/Supplier: Washington State Dept. of Transportation

Location: Fulton Street between Pacific Avenue to California Street

Fiscal summary statement:

The funding sources for this project include a Federal Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) grant of \$880,000 and a Federal Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Improvement (CMAQ) grant of \$120,000 and local matching funds of \$350,000 from Fund 119 – Street Improvements for a total estimated cost of \$1,350,000.

Project summary statement:

Improving Fulton Street from Pacific Avenue to California St. with bike-only pathways and bike-enhanced signalized crossings at the major intersection with Pacific and Hewitt. Sidewalk additions and improvements in the Fulton corridor and north of Hewitt connecting the sidewalk at Hewitt/Fulton to the California St. corridor.

This ordinance will provide funding for the design and construction phase of the improvement project.

Recommendation (exact action requested of Council):

Adopt an Ordinance creating a special improvement project entitled "Fulton Street Bicycle Pedestrian Corridor" Fund 303, Program 125.



ORDINANCE NO. _____

An ORDINANCE creating a special improvement project entitled “Fulton Street Bicycle Pedestrian Corridor” Fund 303, Program 125, to accumulate all costs for the improvement.

WHEREAS,

- A.** The City of Everett is committed to a planned non-motorized transportation infrastructure improvement program.
- B.** The City of Everett has identified the need and obtained funds to design and construct certain pedestrian and bicycle transportation improvements on Fulton Street.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY OF EVERETT DOES ORDAIN:

Section 1. A special improvement project is hereby established as Fund 303, Program 125, entitled “Fulton Street Bicycle Pedestrian Corridor” to accumulate all costs for the improvement. Authorization is hereby given to accumulate costs and distribute payments for the improvement project.

Section 2. Authorization is hereby granted for the “Public Works Director” or “City Engineer” under the direction of the Mayor, to assume full and complete responsibility for conducting all tasks and doing all things to accomplish the actions authorized in this ordinance

Section 3. The sum of \$1,350,000 is hereby appropriated to Fund 303, Program 125, “Fulton Street Bicycle Pedestrian Corridor” as follows:

A. Estimated Project Costs	\$ 1,350,000
B. Source of Funds	
Federal Grant – (TAP, CMAQ)	\$ 1,000,000
Fund 119 – Street Improvements	350,000
Total Funds	<u>\$ 1,350,000</u>

Section 4. The City Clerk and the codifiers of this Ordinance are authorized to make necessary corrections to this Ordinance including, but not limited to, the correction of scrivener’s/clerical errors, references, ordinance numbering, section/subsection numbers, and any internal references.

Section 5. The City Council hereby declares that should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance be declared invalid for any reason, it is the intent of the City Council that it would have passed all portions of this ordinance independent of the elimination of any such portion as may be declared invalid.

Section 6. The enactment of this Ordinance shall not affect any case, proceeding, appeal or other matter currently pending in any court or in any way modify any right or liability, civil or criminal, which may be in existence on the effective date of this Ordinance.

Section 7. It is expressly the purpose of this Ordinance to provide for and promote the health, safety and welfare of the general public and not to create or otherwise establish or designate any particular class or group of persons who will or should be especially protected or benefited by the terms of this Ordinance. It is the specific intent of this Ordinance that no provision or any term used in this Ordinance is intended to impose any duty whatsoever upon the City or any of its officers or employees. Nothing contained in this Ordinance is intended nor shall be construed to create or form the basis of any liability on the part of the City, or its officers, employees or agents, for any injury or damage resulting from any action or inaction on the part of the City related in any manner to the enforcement of this Ordinance by its officers, employees or agents.
