The proposed Funding Ordinance will provide funding for the design and construction administration costs for the Police Property Room Relocation. The source of funds for this project is from Fund 155 – ARPA (ALN 21.027; FAIN SLFRP0494). The ARPA funds will be appropriated to Fund 342, Program 035 (CIP 1). All related design costs are estimated at \$400,000.

Project summary statement:

The City of Everett intends to relocate the Police Property Room from its current leased location to the Culmback Building which is a City owned property. The scope of service includes schematic, architectural, and engineering designs, permitting, and construction documents for the renovation of the Culmback Building.

Recommendation (exact action requested of Council):

Adopt an Ordinance creating a special construction project entitled “Culmback Building Police Property Room Relocation”, fund 342, program 035, to accumulate design costs for the project.

An Ordinance creating a special construction project entitled “Culmback Building Police Property Room Relocation, Fund 342, Program 035, to Accumulate Design Costs for the Project

WHEREAS,

- A. The City Council recognizes the need to provide adequate facilities for its Police evidence storage needs and its employees.
- B. The City Council recognizes the need to utilize existing City owned properties.
- C. The City council recognizes the need to meet the new legislative requirements pertaining to the long-term storage requirements of Police evidence.
- D. The City Council adopted Resolution No. 7817, which identified the Culmback Building Police Property Room Relocation project as an approved use of American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY OF EVERETT DOES ORDAIN:

Section 1. A special construction project is hereby established as Fund 342, Program 035, and shall be entitled “Culmback Building Police Property Room Relocation” to accumulate design costs for the project.

Section 2. Authorization is hereby given to accumulate costs and distribute payments from Fund 342, Program 035 for the special construction project.

Section 3. Authorization is hereby granted to the Parks and Facilities Director, under direction of the Mayor, to assume full and complete responsibility for conducting all tasks and all necessary steps to accomplish the actions authorized in this ordinance.

Section 4. The sum of \$400,000.00 is hereby appropriated to Fund 342, Program 035, “Culmback Building Police Property Room Relocation” as follows:

Section 5. The City Clerk and the codifiers of this Ordinance are authorized to make necessary corrections to this Ordinance including, but not limited to, the correction of scrivener's/clerical errors, references, ordinance numbering, section/subsection numbers, and any internal references.

Section 6. The City Council hereby declares that should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance be declared invalid for any reason, it is the intent of the City Council that it would have passed all portions of this ordinance independent of the elimination of any such portion as may be declared invalid.

Section 7. The enactment of this Ordinance shall not affect any case, proceeding, appeal or other matter currently pending in any court or in any way modify any right or liability, civil or criminal, which may be in existence on the effective date of this Ordinance.

Section 8. It is expressly the purpose of this Ordinance to provide for and promote the health, safety and welfare of the general public and not to create or otherwise establish or designate any particular class or group of persons who will or should be especially protected or benefited by the terms of this Ordinance. It is the specific intent of this Ordinance that no provision or any term used in this Ordinance is intended to impose any duty whatsoever upon the City or any of its officers or employees. Nothing contained in this Ordinance is intended nor shall be construed to create or form the basis of any liability on the part of the City, or its officers, employees or agents, for any injury or damage resulting from any action or inaction on the part of the City related in any manner to the enforcement of this Ordinance by its officers, employees or agents.
