How to use the new crime mapping website:

CrimeMapping.com (Instructional use)

The Everett Police Department has a new crime mapping program where you can get current crime information about your area. The site is live.

The web address is <http://www.crimemapping.com>

That will give you a display of the USA.

Click on Washington and a drop down will give you a list of agencies.

Click on Everett Police and it will take you to a map of downtown Everett.

The default is the downtown area showing all crimes over the most recent week.

NOW-Click on the Address tab and you can insert your home address.

*****You MUST use the city and state in the address tab*****

The display will move to center your address and gives a bubble which you can adjust the radius. I would probably select ½ mile.

You can then select the date tab and change the date range.

There is Everett data going back to July 2012.

You can select the crime types tab and de-select crimes you may not be interested in.

Finally, on the map screen you can click on each icon and it will give you information about the incident. This provides the Everett Police Case number if you would like to request a copy of the report through the public disclosure notice.

One really great thing for your neighborhood is that Snohomish County Sheriff's Office, also participates in the program, so even though some incidents close to you may not be in the Everett PD jurisdiction, they still show up on the map and you can get the same basic information through the SCSO. This is a huge improvement over the old system that only reported Everett incidents.

Another big plus is that this information is updated every day at about 5:00 AM, so you can see what was happening in your neighborhood up to about a day before your search.

One potential drawback- the system is only using incidents where a police report was taken. If no police report is required or prepared there is no map point, even if the Everett Police responded.

Please realize not every police response mandates or requires a police report be prepared.

Please explore and use the crime mapping improvement for your benefit.



RECIPE CORNER

HOMEMADE EGGNOG

Ingredients

12 eggs
 1 ½ Cups sugar
 2 Cups heavy whipping cream
 2 Quarts milk divided
 2 Tbsp vanilla extract
 1 Tsp ground nutmeg
 ½ Tsp salt
 Additional nutmeg, optional



Directions

- In a heavy 4-quart saucepan, whisk together eggs, sugar and salt.
- Gradually add 1 quart of milk then cook and stir over low heat until a thermometer reads 160-170 degrees (about 30-35 minutes)
- Pour into a large heat-proof bowl and stir in the vanilla, nutmeg and remaining milk.
- Place bowl in an ice-water bath, stirring frequently until mixture is cool. If mixture separates, process in a blender until smooth. Cover and refrigerate for at least 3 hours.
- When ready to serve, beat cream in a large bowl on high until soft peaks form. Whisk gently into cooled milk mixture.
- Pour into a chilled 5-quart punch bowl. Sprinkle with nutmeg if desired.

Cover and refrigerate for several days. Whisk before serving. Yield: 3 1/2 quarts
