Our guest speaker this month from the Everett School District will be talking about the upcoming bond and levy project that will be on the ballot in the next election. The bond and levy projects include projects to meet the highest priority needs in four areas:

Safety- particularly school entrances, security camera updates, and update the telephone systems.

Maintenance- renovations of North Middle and Woodside elementary schools. Both schools were built in 1981

Growth needs- building a new elementary school south and get more portables to ease overcrowding.

Equitable access to educational technology- this proposal will be to replace outdated technology and improve the infrastructure to accommodate new technology.
