


Drop off any donations for the egg hunt at the Lilley's - 5120 Seahurst sooner than later, and be there that morning to take it all in!




Nominate your neighbor for the Monte Cristo Awards

Tiles Take Their Rightful Place at the Pumphouse

Have you noticed the brick Pumphouse at the corner of Mukilteo Blvd. and Seahurst Ave. got some new artwork last fall - the sea-themed ceramic tiles on the stair risers?

They join the original 2005 set of neighbor-created tiles, installed when a large-grant neighborhood project transformed the falling-down 1930s eyesore into today's shelter/stairway/viewpoint/garden over a period of three months, with the labor of more than 40 neighbors joining the 3-times-a-week work parties.

The current set of designs was created way back in 2006, but then the ceramics-savvy neighbor who led the project moved away.

Last year, Gene Lilley became determined to turn the designs into ceramic tiles and (grateful for Google) figured out how. After much research and some trips to Seattle Pottery, the tiles are now in place. If you are one of the 2006 artists, your work is finally on display!

Some of the wooden railings which had developed cracks were also replaced, and we'll be looking for helpers to join the crew on April 2 to keep the drought-tolerant pumphouse garden weed-free again this year.
