Night Out Against Crime Ice Cream Social Tues August 2nd 6-8pm at Woodlawn Gardens neighborhood park, 52nd street and west Woodlawn.

This summer, the City of Everett is inspecting specific neighborhood downspouts in the combined sewer area. This includes portions of South Forest Park Neighborhood. In July, you will receive a letter and invitation to participate in this **voluntary** program. If your downspouts qualify for the program, the City, with assistance from its partners, will design and install a downspout disconnection system for your home at no expense to you. Correctly disconnecting your downspouts from the sewer system helps reduce some of the stress heavy rainfall has on the combined system. A combined system is where pipes carry both wastewater (water from our toilets and house / business drains) and storm water (rain or snow that washes off streets / roofs) to the wastewater treatment plant. <https://www.everettwa.gov/815/Downspout-Disconnection>

Dr. Ken Lans will speak about global climate change and its health effects at 2 p.m. Saturday, May 14, 2016 in the Everett Public Library Auditorium, 2702 Hoyt Avenue in Everett. Lans argues that we are already seeing health (and monetary) costs from heat waves and storms and from their resultant fires, floods, and droughts. He will also explore less-obvious health dangers like spreading infectious diseases, conflicts arising from food and water shortages, movement of climate refugees, and air-pollution's role in aggravating existing conditions like heart disease, asthma, and other respiratory illness. He will end his presentation by talking about how concerned citizens can help forestall these dangerous health threats by aiding efforts to reduce our dependence on fossil fuels.

The Heroin Epidemic: Film Screening and Discussion with Community Experts - at 2 p.m. on **Sunday, May 22nd** the Everett Public Library will host a screening of the PBS FRONTLINE film *Chasing Heroin*. Immediately following, a panel discussion with community experts: Susan Kingston, UW Center for Opioid Safety Education; Deputy Chief Mark St. Clair, Everett Police Department; and Cleo Harris from Snohomish County's Alcohol & Other Drugs Treatment Department.

Here's what we need help with:


Baking or donating refreshments. Picking up items from those who need hauling help to dispose of junk. Volunteering at the event to direct traffic and help with unloading and filling containers.
