Sno-Pac has a new phone line for all of those suspicious activity calls that include safety concerns that are non-emergencies. Online crime reporting is available at www.mycrimereport.us

Keep 911 available for emergencies.**Examples of non-emergencies include:**

- A crime that occurred earlier and there is no suspect
- A situation where emergency services are needed, but there is no immediate danger to life or property
- A found pet or property item
- Illegal fireworks

911 Tips:

- Call if there is an immediate threat to life or property.
- If you call 911 by mistake, stay on the line. Let the dispatcher know there is no emergency.
- Know your location! 911 services may not automatically know your location.
