▪ Block Watch Initiative

Bayside Neighborhood Association (BNA) has been busy over the summer introducing the benefits of Block Watch to our residents. We are ready to have the city begin installation throughout Bayside of the iconic blue signs with black and white graphics.

In function, a block watch neighborhood is one that knows its residents, is aware of where its most frail and elderly live, is engaged in the betterment of the environment within its boundaries, and works with the city and police department in discouraging crime and vagrancy.

Neighbors who sign up to participate in the anti-crime program complete a registration form, provided by the City of Everett, which includes name, address, make and model of car and contact information.

Five households registered in the Block Watch program in the same block = One Block Watch sign, according to City of Everett's crime prevention officer, Eddie Golden.
