Learn how sex trafficking targets runaway or neglected kids

EVERETT – As part of its year-long series, [Everett Reads: Beyond the Streets](#), the [Everett Public Library will screen The Long Night](#) by award-winning photojournalist Tim Matsui on Saturday, March 18, at 2 p.m. in the Main Library Auditorium.

When Matsui won the 2012 Alexia Foundation's Women's Initiative Grant, he was at last able to begin documenting a story he had been researching for several years. The result of this work is *The Long Night*, a documentary about child sex trafficking in the Seattle area, a 70-minute film that not only shows the impact of trafficking on the children and their parents, but also on the police officers working to end the underage sex trade.

Stay after the film to participate in a discussion with Norene Roberts, liaison at the Washington State Children's Administration's Commercially Sexually Exploited Children's, and Laura LeMoon, Cocoon House Human Trafficking Advocate.
