EVERETT – [We recently shared news](#) that our Safe Streets work crew program, one of the City's diversion programs, continues down a successful path as it provides low-level offenders an alternative to jail time after it got started nearly one year ago.

On Tuesday, the Seattle-based news station, [KING 5, talked with work crew](#) participants working off their charges and retired Everett Police Bike Patrol Officer Jack Jessup, who now serves as the work crew manager.
