KING 5 reporter joins COET for ride along, gets inside look at a day in the life of the team

EVERETT – If you are an avid KING 5 viewer, then Jake Whittenberg, reporter and anchor for the local NBC affiliate, is a familiar face.

Recently, Jake took a ride along with Everett’s [Community Outreach and Enforcement Team \(COET\)](#) to get a feel for what the team faces on a daily basis, including the challenges of navigating the system, as well as the successes of connecting some of Everett’s most vulnerable people with services.
