Free public naloxone training at Everett Public Library

EVERETT – The Everett Public Library, in partnership with Snohomish County Human Services, is hosting a free public [naloxone nasal spray training](#) on Wednesday, Jan. 31, from 6-7:30 p.m. at the Main Library auditorium, 2702 Hoyt Ave, Everett.

Community members are invited to join Amy Austin, opioid outreach specialist with Snohomish County Human Services, in learning how to administer naloxone, also known as Narcan, a nasal spray that can block the effects of an opioid overdose. This free training will also include information about opioids, how they affect the human body, who is at risk of an overdose, and what an opioid overdose looks like and about the overdose antidote.

Narcan will not be provided to those attending the training, though attendees will learn how to purchase it.

Several law enforcement agencies in the county, including the Everett Police Department, are now using Narcan to reverse overdose symptoms. As of Dec. 2017, Everett Police have reversed 67 overdoses using Narcan.
