Splash Down Science

Here is a 'nuts and bolts' list of things you need to know before dropping your child off at camp:

Camp Location & Drop off/Pick up:

- Drop off is between 9:45 and 10:00 am **at Langus Riverfront Park** in Everett. Address: 400 Smith Island Rd, Everett, WA 98201. A map and directions to the park are included with this parent packet. Please be at Langus Riverfront Park at 4:00 pm daily to pick up your child. **EXCEPTION: on Wednesday, July 13 we will be spending the entire day at Silver Lake Thornton A. Sullivan Park. Please arrange to drop off and pick up at Silver Lake 11405 West Silver Lake Rd, meeting near the main walking entrance to the park.**

What to bring to camp:

- **Apparel:** Make sure your child is prepared for both hot and cold weather conditions as appropriate. Layers work well. We will be outside all day every day this week, and weather will not stop us from our field explorations.
 - Provide tennis shoes daily. **NO FLIP FLOPS on any day.** If your child has rain boots that are OK to get muddy, please provide those on the first day of camp. We will use them at various times throughout the week, and return them with your camper on the last day of camp.
 - Rain gear – Please check the weather forecast. If rain is predicted please pack a rain jacket and pants (if possible). Your child will be outside, rain or shine.
- **Day Pack:** Kids will need a day pack for personal supplies each day of camp. Please pack the following items:
 - **Lunch:** Please provide your child with a *hearty* sack lunch each day. Refrigeration and microwaves are not available.
 - **Sunscreen:** Please apply sunscreen before camp and send additional sun screen with your child so that he/she can re-apply throughout the day. On occasion staff may need to apply sunscreen to your child. If this is a problem, please notify the staff.
 - **Spare change of clothes**
 - **Towel and swimsuit- For Wednesday and Friday ONLY**
 - **Sun hat and sun glasses**
 - **Reusable water bottle**
 - **Bug spray (optional)** –Please double bag your bug spray.
- On Friday, July 24, your child is welcome to bring a fishing pole and tackle for fishing from the pier at Langus Park (we will have a few poles available – no license needed)

Medication:

- If your child requires prescription medication **during** camp hours, please read and complete the attached Medication Information and Waiver form, and bring it with you on the first day of camp.

Safety:

- We will always have onsite medical equipment and trained staff in case of emergencies. Staff will have cell phones with them at all times in case of emergency and/or if you need to contact your child. Cell phone numbers are listed at the end of this letter.

Conduct:

- Campers are expected to arrive with a positive attitude and willingness to participate. Additionally, any camper who does not respect staff, other campers, the environment, or equipment will be asked to meet with a staff member and the parent/guardian. If a solution cannot be reached, or inappropriate behavior continues, the child will be asked to leave camp.

What NOT to bring to camp:

- Please do not send your child to camp with electronic devices (Cell phones, iPod, Gameboy, Etc.) .
- No valuables (jewelry, special watches, special clothes, etc.) should be brought to camp as backpacks may be left unattended at times while we are in the field conducting our research.

From the north, take I-5 exit 198 (N. Broadway) at Marysville. The exit to reach the park is approximately 1 mile from the I-5 exit. You will see signs as you approach "Langus Riverfront Park next right". Follow the signage to the park.

From the south, take exit 195. Turn left onto East Marine View Drive at the bottom of the exit ramp. Continue 1.2 miles to the entrance ramp onto Highway 529 (Marysville). Proceed north on Highway 99, over the bridge and take the first road on your right. At the next intersection, turn left. You will pass Dagmar Marine. Follow the sign at the overpass to the Park. Langus Riverfront Trail begins just south of the park.







From the north, take exit 186 (128th Street) from I-5 and turn left onto 128th Street SE. Proceed east on 128th SE to 19th Avenue SE (Bothell-Everett Hwy) and turn left onto 19th Ave. SE. Continue north to 112th Street SE. Turn left onto 112th St. SE. Proceed approximately four blocks to the 14th Avenue intersection just before the overpass of I-5. Turn left onto 14th Avenue. As it curves, it becomes Silver Lake Road. The park is on the left.

From the south, take exit 186 (128th Street) from I-5 and turn right onto 128th Street SE. Proceed east on 128th SE to 19th Avenue SE (Bothell-Everett Highway) and turn left onto 19th Ave. SE. Continue north to 112th Street SE. Turn left onto 112th St. SE. Proceed approximately four blocks to the 14th Avenue intersection just before the overpass of I-5. Turn left onto 14th Avenue. As it curves, it becomes Silver Lake Road. The park is on the left.
