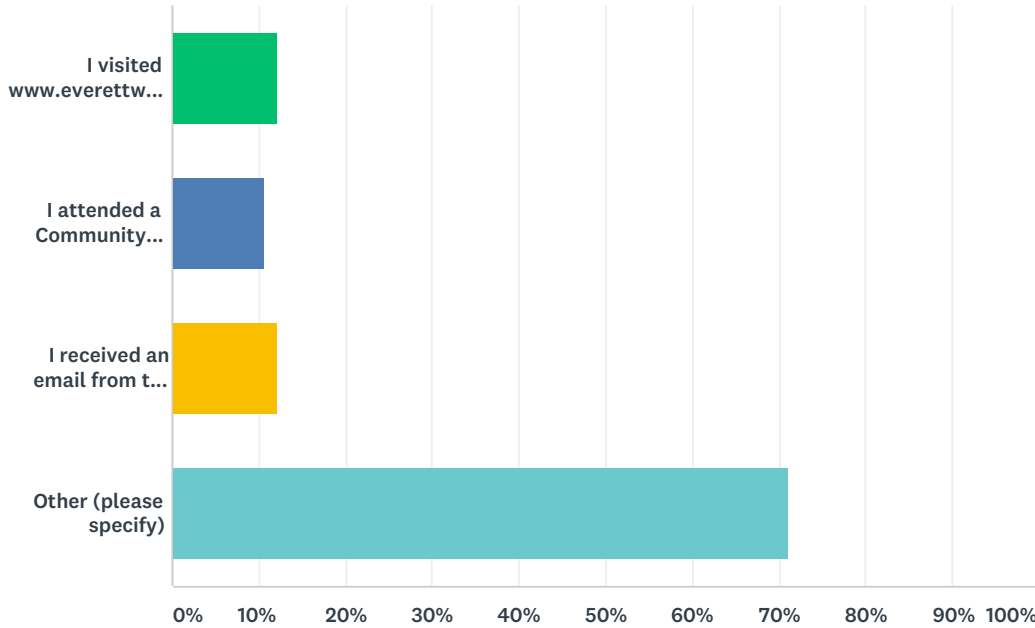


Q1 How did you hear about this survey? Please choose all that apply.

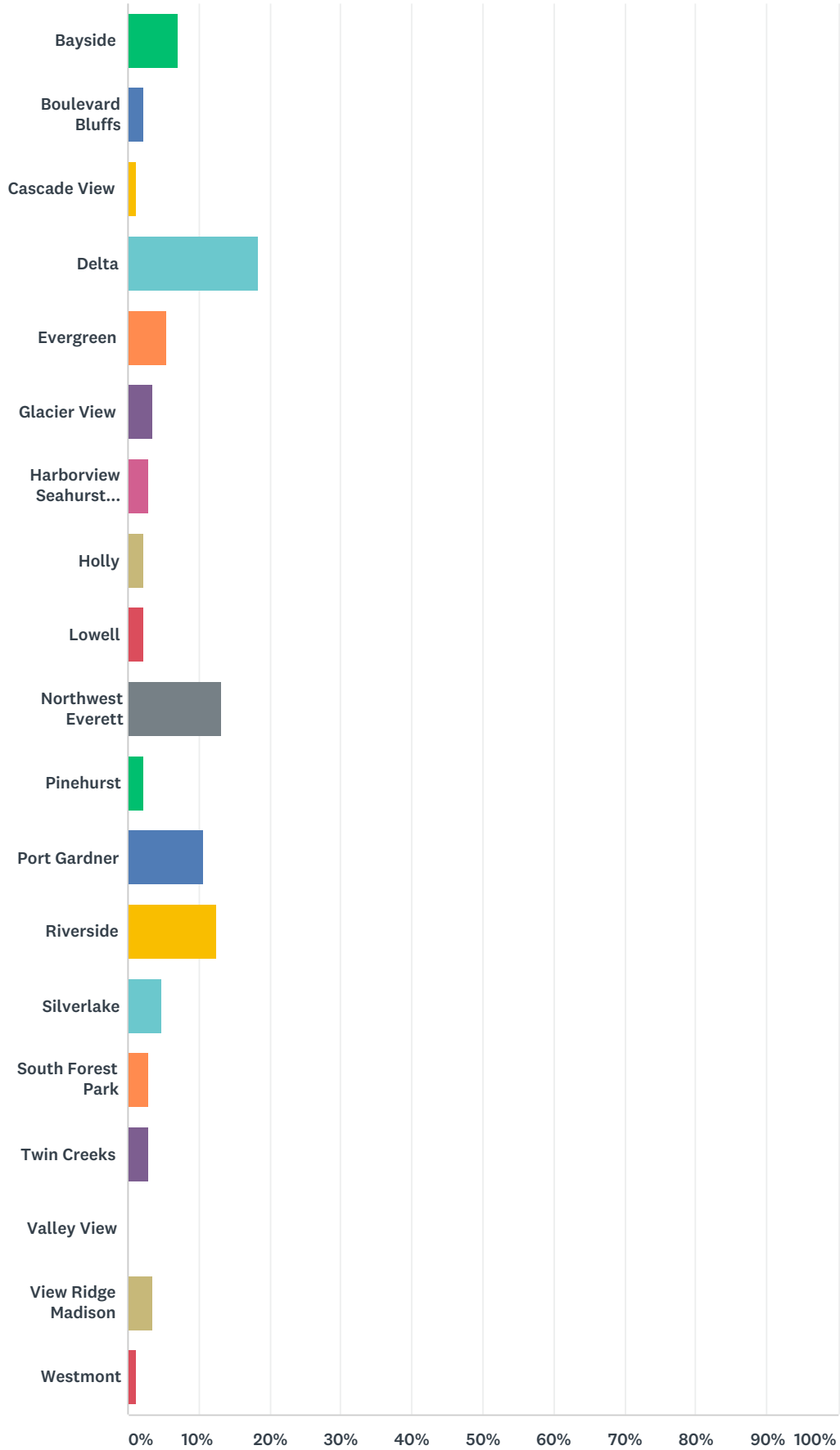

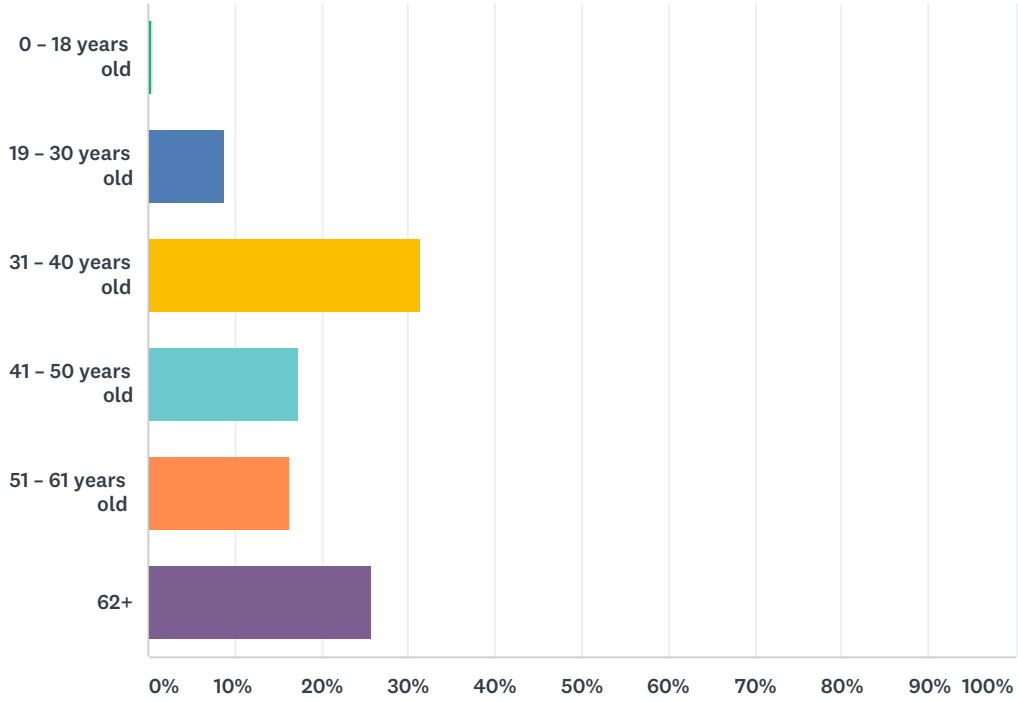

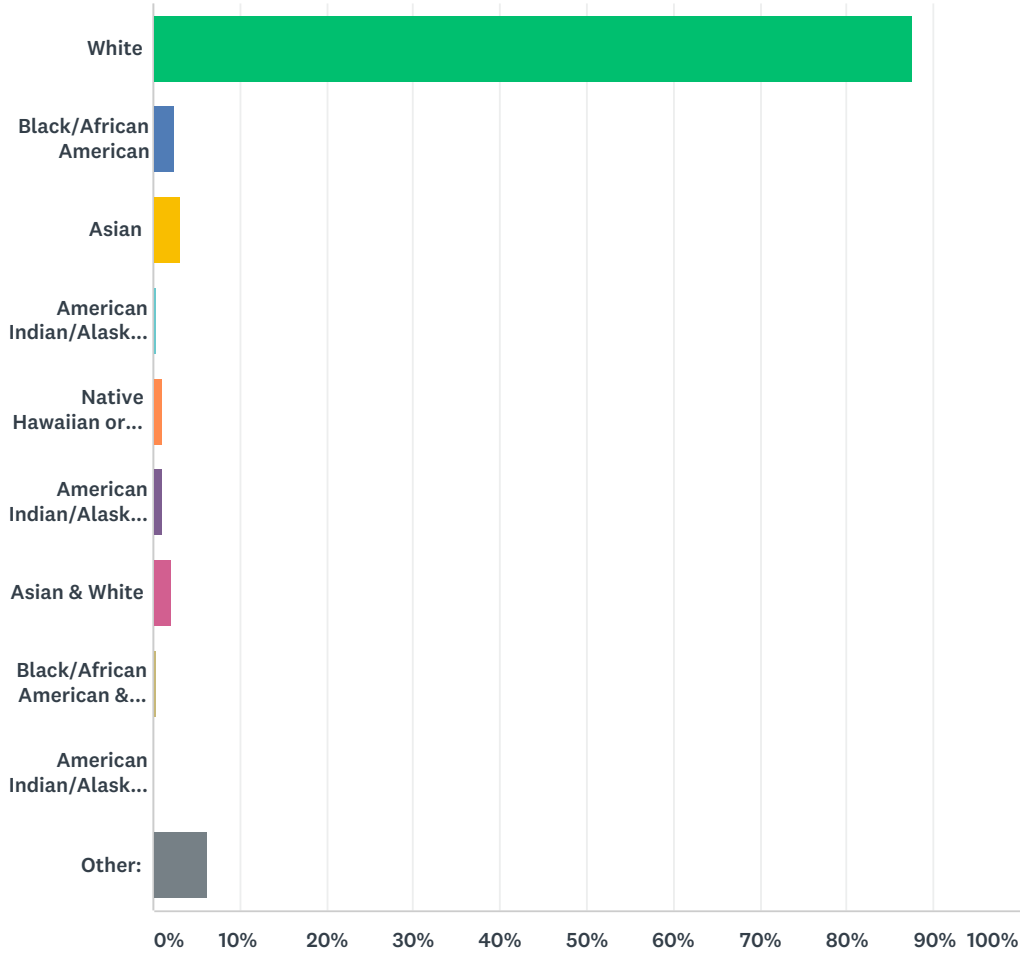

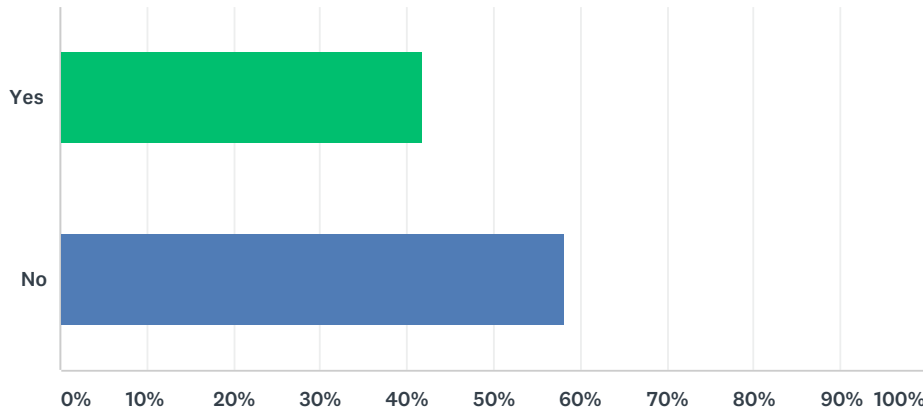

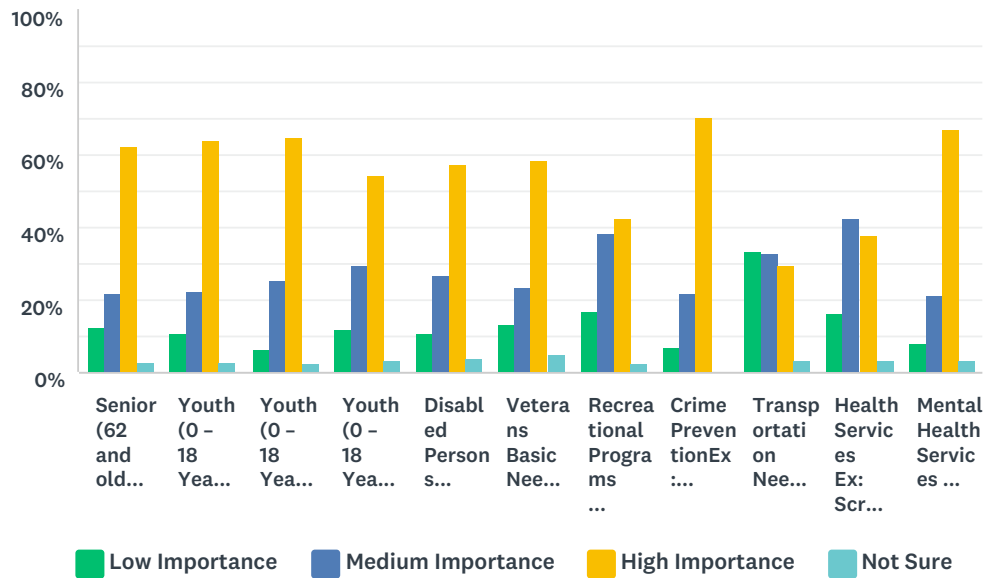

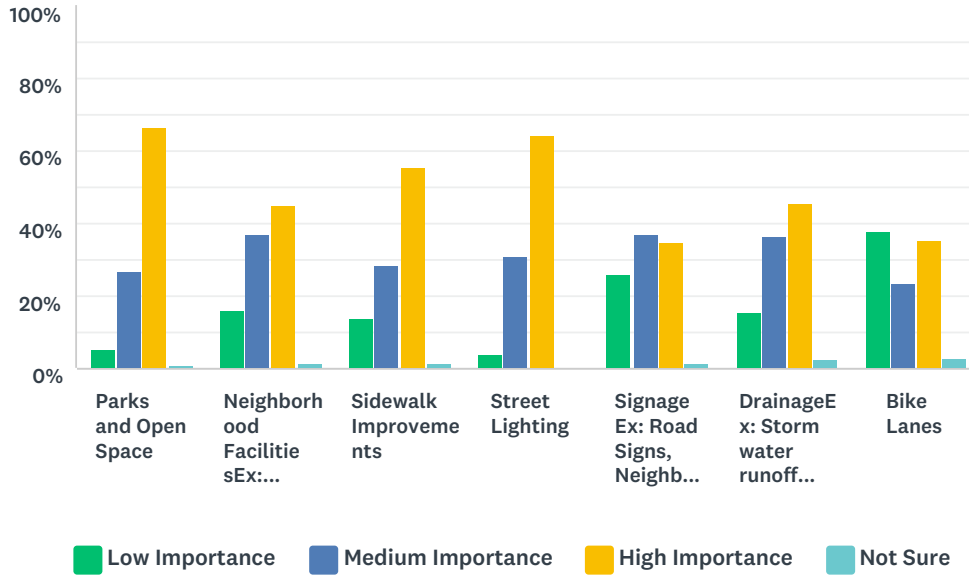

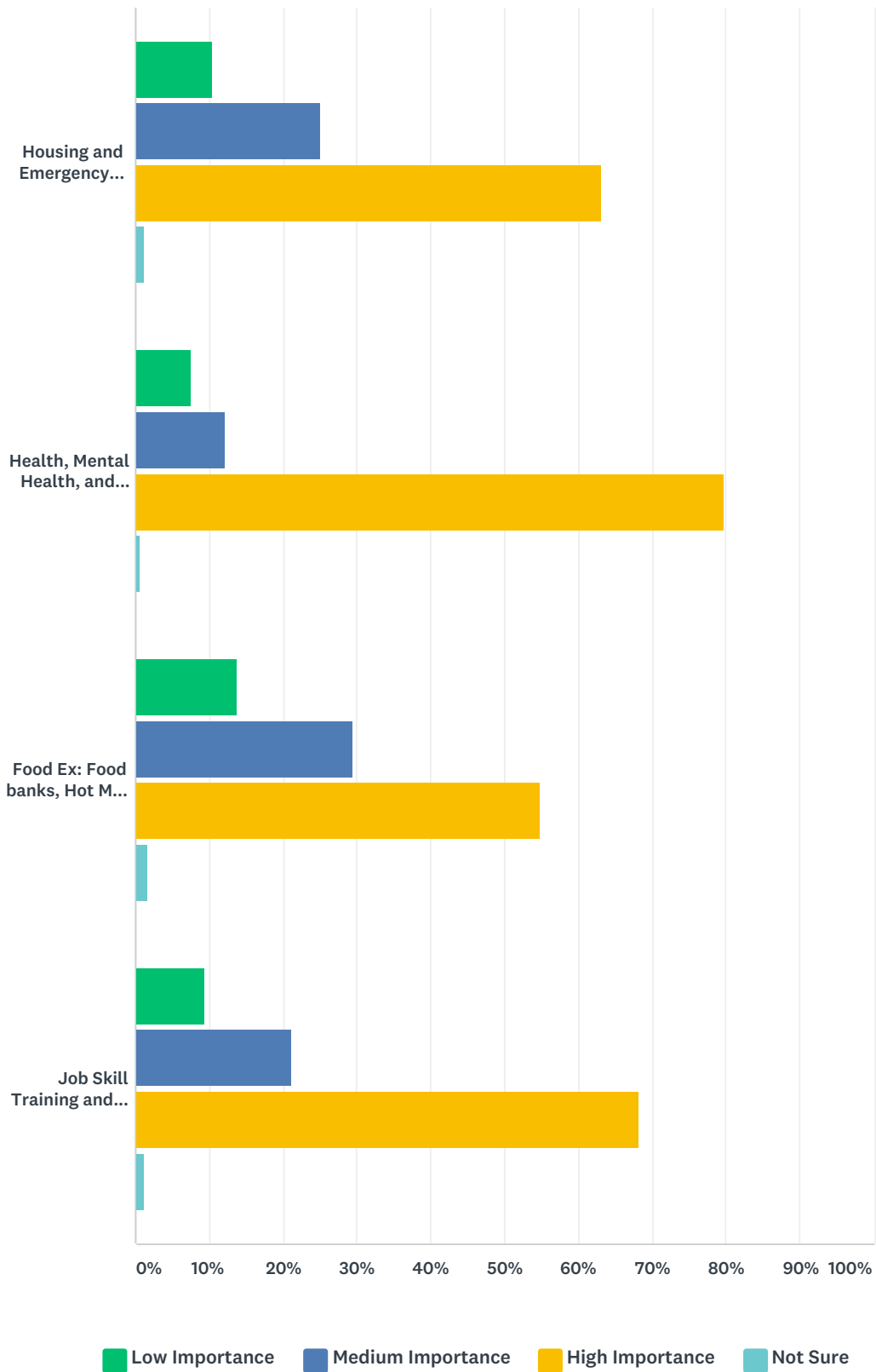

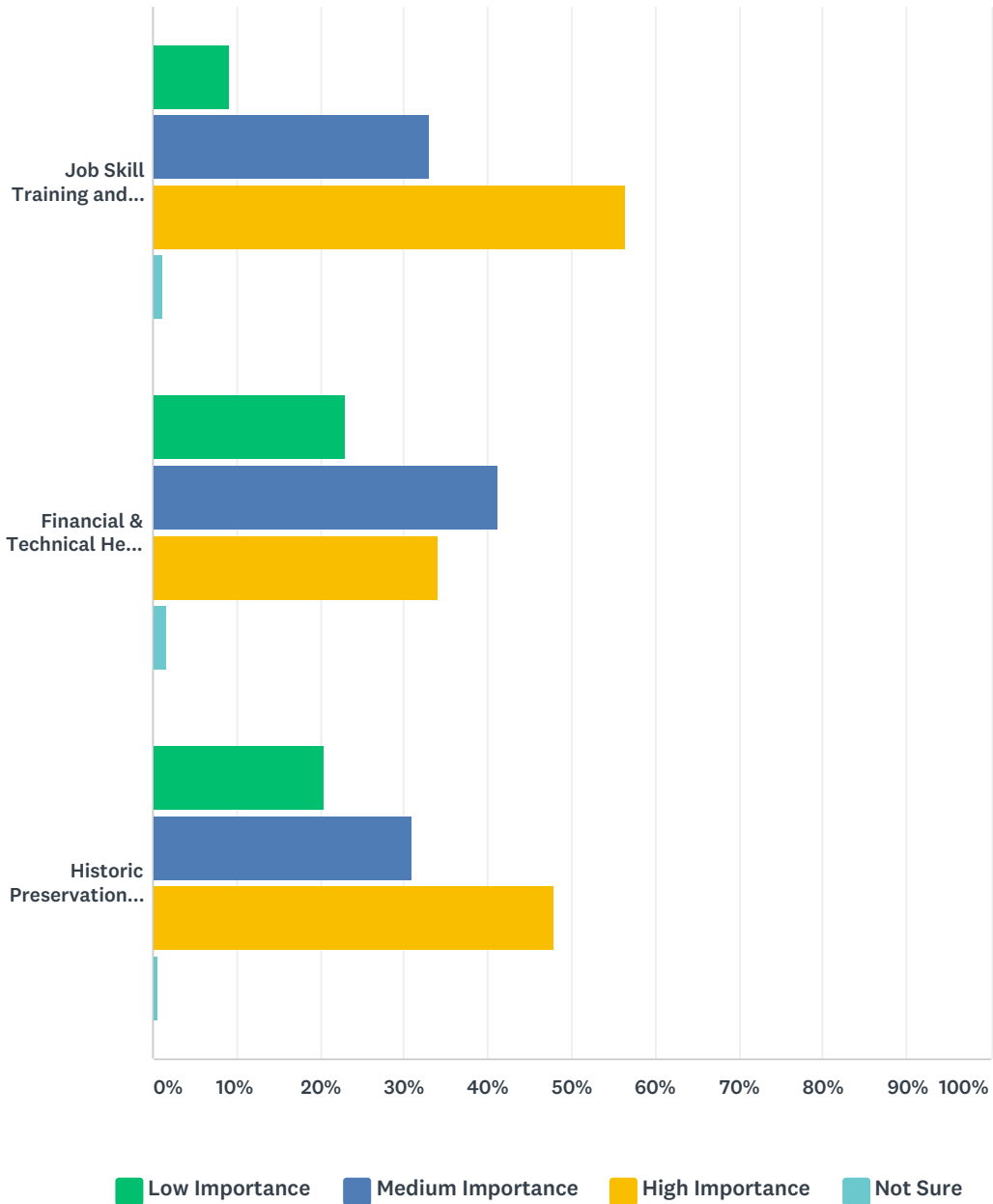

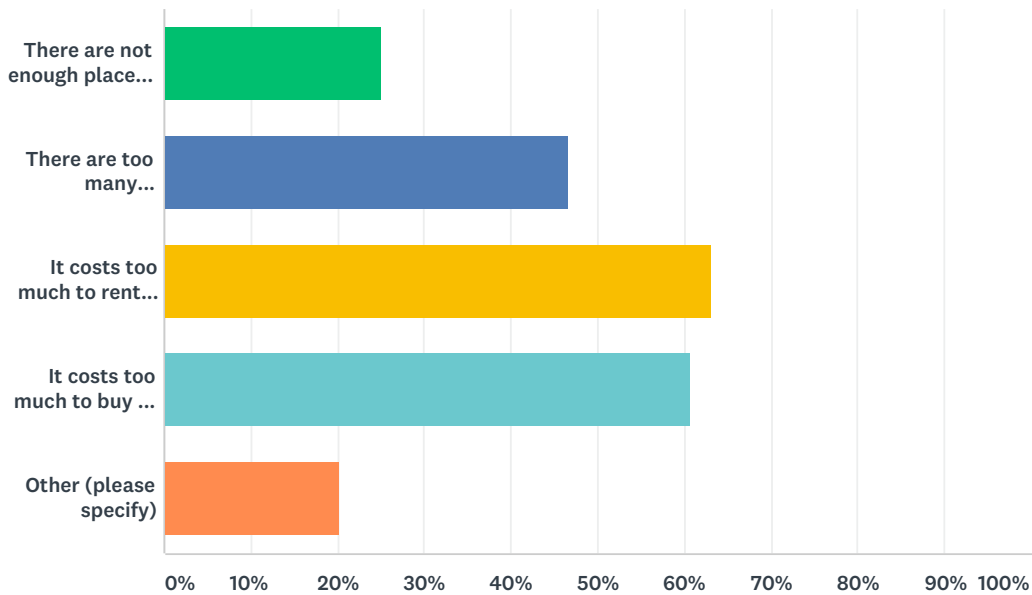
