

**RESOLUTION No. 6704**

**Resolution for Expenditure of 2014 Human Needs Funding**

**WHEREAS**, the City allocates funding each year to be used for human needs programs; and

**WHEREAS**, \$312,600 is included in the 2014 budget for this purpose; and

**WHEREAS**, there exists in the community a call for funds to supplement human needs programs; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council adopted priorities for Human Needs funding on November 27, 2013; and


